Transcript of excerpts from broadcast of "Jazz Odyssey", with Dennis Allee, Tuesday August 16, 5-9PM, just following her Newport Jazz Festival debut – on WOMR 92.1 FM, broadcasting from Provincetown, MA

" I started the show tonight with a young artist named Rachael Price who appeared on Saturday at the Newport Jazz Festival. I did not hear her but when I was there on Sunday I just reached to pick out a CD because, as some of my listeners know, I love female jazz vocalists. I had never heard of this gal before and she had appeared there with T.S. Monk – Thelonious Monk's son the drummer – the day before. And when I got home I put it on, and it blew my mind. I could not believe it. As some of you know, I'm a pretty tough critic when it comes to female vocalists. I've got hundreds of them in my collection, and I just loved this lady. "
